I am proud to say with the generous support of local Foundations we gave back nearly \$120,000 in racing and education products to community partners, schools, and other not-for-profits. 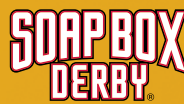

THE HISTORY OF THE SOAP BOX DERBY



The Derby dates back to 1934, when the first All-American race was held in Dayton, Ohio.

The All-American program has grown to more than 1,300 races and more than 100 racing cities throughout the world each year.

The FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby Racing Program and the STEM-Based Education Program provide educational opportunities and youth leadership development for youth in grades K-12.

The Gravity Racing Challenge STEM Team Competition, Soap Box Derby Mini-Car Program, Soap Box Derby STEM camps and our STEM Curriculum are being used by more than 700 schools.

1934



First All-American Soap Box Derby ran in Dayton, Ohio. The winner was 11 year-old Bob Turner of Muncie, Indiana.

1935



The second All-American Soap Box Derby was moved to Akron and ran on Tallmadge Avenue Hill.

1936



Derby Downs opened. Built by the Works Progress Administration (WPA).

1946



Soap Box Derby racing resumed after a four year suspension during World War II.

1971



Girls competed in Soap Box Derby racing for the first time.

1976



The Junior-Division was added for racers ages 10-12 with cars built from hardware supplied in a kit and with patterns for the floorboards.

1986



The first sanctioned rally races were held. Racers had potential to earn a wildcard slot for the All-American Soap Box Derby.

1992



The Stock Car division was added for ages 8 through 13. A new headquarters building opened on the west side of the track.

1993



Rally division champions qualify for The All-American Championship Race.

1995



Super Stock kit cars replaced kit cars in 1995.

1997



The first Hall of Fame recipient, Myron Scott, was honored in 1997 to recognize individuals devoting extreme time, talent and financial support toward the Soap Box Derby.

2012



More than 550 racers ages 7 to 17 competed in the 75th FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby. They represented 40 states, Canada, Germany, Japan and New Zealand.

2019



The Soap Box Derby installed a new electronic scoreboard in July of 2019 to advance and refine our scoring system.

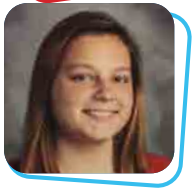

Sarah Kolesar, 16, started competing in Soap Box Derby events in 2015, and qualified for the 2018 FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby as a Rally champion. She represented the Akron local as Super Stock champion in July's All-American race. She also competes in rallies throughout Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia. Since 2015, Kolesar has volunteered as a co-pilot in local and national SuperKids races for special needs children. She also encourages other racers, volunteers in the Soap Box Derby headquarters office at Derby Downs, as well as for her church and at Green High School where she is in her junior year.

Xander Nihart, 18, started racing in 2015, as part of the Soap Box Derby's STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) education program in Columbus, Ohio. He competed in the 2018 FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby as a Super Stock rally champion and returned in 2019 as a Masters rally champion. He serves on the Columbus local Derby organization's board of directors and volunteers in Columbus, Lancaster and in Akron to help set up the track equipment and live streaming the races. Nihart also is a co-pilot for SuperKids races. He graduated this spring from Ohio Connections Academy and began studying machinery operations in August 2019 at Knox County Career Center in Mount Vernon.

Allison Pankoff, 19, started racing in 2008 and has competed in the FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby six times: as the local champion in both the Stock and Super Stock division in Littleton, Colorado, as local Masters division champ in Colorado Springs, and as a rally champion three times. Pankoff was the 2018 world champion in the Rally Masters competition. Since 2012, she has volunteered by sharing her Soap Box Derby experiences to increase awareness of the program and to encourage other racers. She became a member of the All-American's A-team technical support group earlier this year. Pankoff also volunteers for Denver Parks and Recreation programs, 4-H and Girl Scouts. She began her junior year in the fall of 2019 at Colorado State University, studying animal science and agricultural business.

Abigail Waldron Lloyd, 20, helps build awareness in the Soap Box Derby by telling her story at mall shows and other venues. She has been volunteering since 2011, helping locally to teach driving skills to younger racers and how to enjoy participating in the Soap Box Derby. Since 2015, she also volunteers for the All-American activities in Akron. Waldron Lloyd has competed in the FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby seven times: as both a local Super Stock and Masters champion and as a Rally champion five times. She returned in 2019, as a Masters division rally champion. She is studying accounting at Virginia Western Community College.

BRIAN GRAHAM OF FALLBROOK, CALIFORNIA



Brian Graham helped establish the Soap Box Derby program in Oceanside, California, which staged its first race in 1995. He served as local race director as well as a board member from 1995 through 2005. He joined the All-American Soap Box Derby's rally commission in 1997, and served as its chairman from 2015 through 2017. He became an assistant regional director in 1998, and ended in 2019. Brian has been active in the California Family Soap Box Derby Association and has served as announcer for many Soap Box Derby events throughout California and during race week in Akron.



ED HARMON OF AKRON, OHIO

Edgar "Ed" Harmon, 85, is a life-long Akron resident who raced in the Akron local race for three years beginning in 1947. He returned to the Soap Box Derby scene in 1985, when his oldest grandson first raced. He became a board member for the Akron local organization in 1998, then a member of the A-Team technical support group for the All-American Soap Box Derby. Harmon has contributed his technical expertise for local races in Akron and in Portage County, Ohio, as well as at the All-American championships and SuperKids events by setting up electronic systems for communications, safety, security, timing and race operations. He has advised 17 grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren, who participated in Soap Box Derby races.



WILL LOOMAN OF AKRON, OHIO

Will Looman began volunteering for the Akron local Soap Box Derby organization in 1980, and served on its board of directors from 1983 through 1996. He was director of the Akron local race from 1987 through 1993, during which time he also began volunteering in technical roles for the All-American Soap Box Derby. In the early 1990s, he joined the All-American's National Control Board (now called the Racing Commission, the top technical and race operations body), on which he continues to serve. Looman was commission chairman from 2012 through 2014, and has served as race director of the All-American world championships since 2012.

Established in 1997, The Soap Box Derby® Hall of Fame honors individuals who have made exemplary contributions to improve the sport, enhance the youth racing program or help its participants through significant financial or sponsorship support.

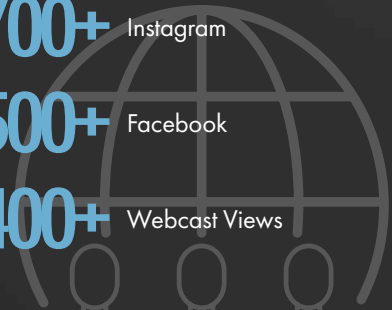

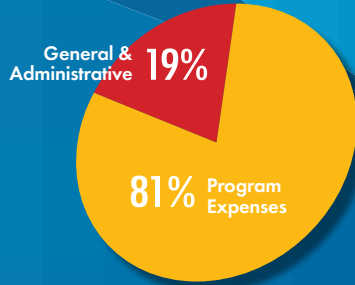

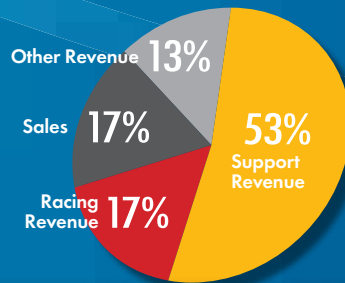
