PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Every year, it is my honor and privilege to address all constituents of the Soap Box Derby in this annual report, including our sponsors, donors, volunteers, community partners and, most importantly, the

thousands of boys and girls and their families who participate in local races, rallies, education programs and other events in communities throughout the United States and several foreign countries.



The year 2020 has been like none other in our lifetimes. Our world changed dramatically early last spring when the COVID-19 pandemic began its attacks on our daily lives. We worked diligently to develop approaches to stage race events that could run safely for participants, volunteers and spectators. Unfortunately, it simply could not happen. After many local races and rallies were canceled and concerns were growing for travel and for safe gatherings of large numbers of people, we made the difficult decision to suspend all racing and the FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby for the first time since World War II.

Our organization is heartened and grateful for the support of our title sponsor FirstEnergy, other sponsors, foundations, donors, volunteers and community leaders who have remained loyal to the Soap Box Derby during this challenging year. We also are especially thankful for the efforts of our Racing and Rally Commissions, Regional Directors and local race organizations around the country who

have played such a vital role to keep the Soap Box Derby moving forward.

We were extremely sad that youth and their families could not race over the spring and summer. However, we are pleased that many of our local race organizations have been able to return to racing this fall by staging nearly half of the rally events of a pre-pandemic fall season.

Education continues to play a vital role in Soap Box Derby participation. In addition to hands-on programs in schools, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, 4-H and churches also are important to growth in our racing program. We are thankful that foundations and donor support has enabled us to give back nearly \$100,000 during the year in education programs for schools in Akron, Summit County and Northeast Ohio.

As we move into 2021 while continuing to navigate through COVID challenges, our first priority will remain the safety and well-being of our racers, families, volunteers and staff. Social distancing, hand cleansing and size restrictions of gatherings will be part of our lives for the foreseeable future.

We look forward to successful local races and rallies that will send champions to Akron next July for the 83rd running of the FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby.

Thank you for your support and we are excited to welcome you back to Derby Downs in 2021!

THE HISTORY OF THE SOAP BOX DERBY

The Derby dates back to 1934, when the first All-American race was held in Dayton, Ohio.

The All-American program has grown to more than 1,300 races and more than 100 racing cities throughout the world each year.

The FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby Racing Program and the STEM-Based Education Program provide educational opportunities and youth leadership development for youth in grades K-12.

The Gravity Racing Challenge STEM Team Competition, Soap Box Derby Mini-Car Program, Soap Box Derby STEM camps and our STEM Curriculum are being used by more than 830 schools.

1934



First All-American Soap Box Derby ran in Dayton, OH. The winner was 11-year-old Bob Turner of Muncie, IN.

1935



The second All-American Soap Box Derby was moved to Akron and ran on Tallmadge Avenue Hill.

1936



Derby Downs opened. Built by the Works Progress Administration (WPA).

1946



Soap Box Derby racing resumed after a four-year suspension during World War II.

1971



Girls competed in Soap Box Derby racing for the first time.

1975



11-year-old Karren Stead of Lower Bucks County, PA, became the first girl to win the All-American Soap Box Derby World Championship.

1976



The Junior-Division was added for racers ages 10-12 with cars built from hardware supplied in a kit and with patterns for the floorboards.

1986



The first sanctioned rally races were held. Racers had potential to earn a wildcard slot for the All-American Soap Box Derby.

1992



The Stock Car division was added for ages 8 through 13. A new headquarters building opened on the west side of the track.

1993



Rally division champions qualify for The All-American Championship Race.

1995



Super Stock kit cars replaced kit cars in 1995.

1997



Myron Scott was honored as the first Hall of Fame recipient to recognize devotion of time, talent and financial support.

2012



More than 550 racers ages 7 to 17 competed in the 75th FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby. They represented 40 states, Canada, Germany, Japan and New Zealand.

2016



The Soap Box Derby Scholarship fund was renamed to the Bill Speeg Memorial Scholarship fund.

2017



Marion Wells of Indianapolis, IN became the first African-American All-American Soap Box Derby World Champion.

2020



Soap Box Derby Local and Rally racing was impeded due to COVID-19 and the FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby World Championship was canceled.

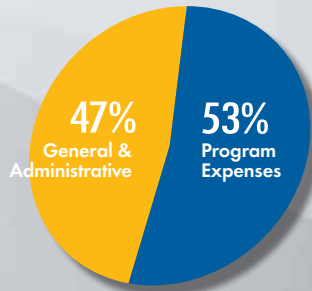

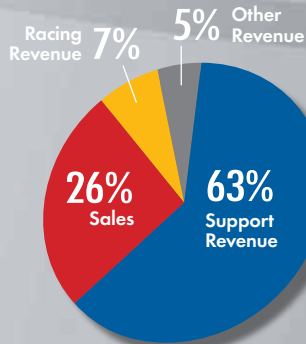

Erin Donovan, 16, is a third-generation racer who has been competing in local Soap Box Derby events since 2011. She won the Local Stock division race in Conshohocken, Pennsylvania, in 2012, making her first of eight trips to the FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box as a local or rally champion. She won the world championship twice – in the Rally Stock division in 2013 and in Rally Super Stock in 2019. At local races and rallies, Erin mentors other racers to help familiarize them with various racing procedures and driving skills. During the Akron All-American finals, she volunteers for various events at the track. She will be a junior this fall at Methacton High School in Eagleville.

Braedon Quinlan, 18, raced in all divisions of the Soap Box Derby – Stock, Super Stock, and Masters – over a 10 year-period beginning in 2009. He won the Super Stock title in the Arlington Soap Box Derby in 2017, earning a berth in that year's FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby. He also raced in Akron in 2019 in the new Legacy division. Quinlan has been a volunteer in the Arlington Derby program since he was 13, described by race officials as an "indispensable contributor" and "natural leader" who will volunteer in any way to support and promote the local Soap Box Derby program. He recently graduated from Arlington High School and will attend Skidmore College in Saratoga Springs, New York this fall.

Lukas Ramey, 16, first competed in 2012 in the Soap Box Derby in Madisonville, Kentucky and won the Stock division championship in 2013. He represented Madisonville at the 2013 All-American championships – the first of seven consecutive years in Akron as a Local or Rally champion in all three racing divisions. He won the world championship in the 2015 Rally Stock competition, bringing media and community attention to the Madisonville program. Since 2012, Ramey has helped promote Soap Box Derby interest through presentations at local events, riding in parades, mall and museum displays and media interviews. He helps with set-up and race day operations in several cities. Ramey will be a junior at Madisonville North Hopkins High School in the fall.

Samantha Uhler, 18, has raced in Soap Box Derby competitions for seven seasons, starting in the Masters division in Dubois, Pennsylvania in 2014. She earned berths in the All-American Soap Box Derby as a rally champion in 2016, as local champion in the Masters division in 2017, local Super Stock champion in 2018 and a rally masters contestant in 2019. A member of the junior committee of the Dubois race organization, Samantha raises racing interest through school projects. She openly shares her knowledge of car construction and driving skills with younger racers and helps with track set-up and tear-down. She helped prepare faculty to teach Soap Box Derby technology as part of the Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) curriculum for elementary and middle school students. She graduated this spring from Bald Eagle High School in Wingate, Pennsylvania.

JOHN EVANS OF LEE'S SUMMIT, MISSOURI

John Evans, 79, grew up in Independence, Missouri and raced in the nearby Kansas City Soap Box Derby for four years beginning in 1952. Evans won the local race when he was 14 in 1955 and competed in the All-American Soap Box Derby. He never lost his passion for the Soap Box Derby, joining the Kansas City Derby board in 1990, and continues to serve as a local advisor. Evans has been a regional director of the All-American Soap Box Derby since 2002, advising local race programs in eight states from Missouri north to North Dakota and west to Wyoming. His interest in racing was passed down to daughter Megan who raced beginning in 1995. She was the world rally champion at the 2002 All-American in the Super Stock division. Evans is a commercial real estate developer and owner.



WILLIAM J. GINTER OF AKRON, OHIO

Bill Ginter, 74, became involved in the Soap Box Derby in late 2009, leading an effort to stabilize the financial position and operations of the organization. As a long-time Akron civic leader, Ginter engaged local government and the business community to provide financial, management and governance support to the youth racing program. He joined the Soap Box Derby board of directors in 2010 and served as chairman from 2011 through 2016. Ginter was instrumental in securing FirstEnergy Corporation as title sponsor in 2012. He continues as an honorary board member of the Soap Box Derby and is a current or former officer or board member of United Way of Summit County, Akron Red Cross, Greater Akron Chamber, Summit County Board of Development Disabilities, Summa Health System, Summa Foundation, Workforce Development Board and BlueCoats. He retired as executive vice president and chief operating officer of Advanced Elastomer Systems in 1998; he is a commercial real estate developer and serves on the advisory boards of several private companies.



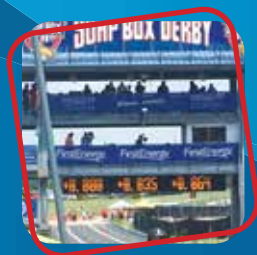
BOBBY NICKOLI OF LAGRANGE, OHIO

Bobby Nickoli, who passed away this year at 71, started racing in the Cleveland Soap Box Derby in 1960, winning the local race and competing in the All-American Soap Box Derby in 1964. As a teenager, he helped promote the Soap Box Derby through presentations at Boy Scout meetings. In the late 1960s, he helped launch the Soap Box Derby in Amherst, Ohio, and later became active in the Cleveland race, where he has served as an inspector and race director. Nickoli helped plan and build the permanent Cleveland racetrack. He joined the A-Team at the All-American Soap Box Derby in 2003 and served as a member of the Racing Commission from 2015 through 2019. Nickoli helped set up the Ultimate Speed division in the early 2000s and continued as an Ultimate Speed official through 2018. He also helped launch the Legacy division in 2019. Nickoli was a member of the competition committee and an honorary member of the Soap Box Derby board of directors. He was a retired accountant and was a wonderful person to all those who knew him.

Established in 1997, The Soap Box Derby® Hall of Fame honors individuals who have made exemplary contributions to improve the sport, enhance the youth racing program or help its participants through significant financial or sponsorship support.

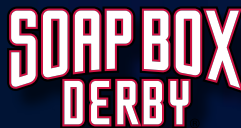
